## Joseph Conrad 1857 - 1924

To mark the fiftieth anniversary of the death of Conrad, Dent are bringing out in July a searching new study of this great novelist.

During his lifetime Conrad achieved fame for his powerful sea-stories; in recent years his greatness has been recognized both as an innovator in the art of the novel and in the courage with which he opposed all that is black and nihilistic in modern experience.

C.B. Cox takes a closer look than usual at the relation between Conrad's verbal expression and his aims, and challenges previous 'explanations' of his meaning. His main concern is to examine the major novels and stories, but while he explores the roles and significance of such characters as Lord Jim, Kurtz, Nostromo and the narrator-figure Marlow, we are never far from Conrad's own preoccupations with suicide, exile and the impossible between disillusion and commitment. £ 3.75

# A Short History of English Literature

#### HARRY BLAMIRES

Harry Blamires has written an engaging and scholarly guide to some six centuries of English literature — from Chaucer's time when the language became recognizably our own, to the Angry Young Men of the 1950s. In this comprehensive and up to date account the author analyses the background, inter-connections and major achievements of individual writers in each period, giving the reader a sense of both of the continuing literary tradition and of the radical changes that, for example, the Romantic Movement brought in. Considerable attention is given to twentieth century poets, novelists and playwrights, from Auden, Eliot and Pound to Beckett, Pinter and Joyce.

The book is fairly informal in presentation and aims to leave the reader well informed about each writer's output, sensitive to the special character of his gifts, and aware of his relationship to his contemporaries and successors.

A readable and concise guide, the book will be invaluable both to students of Englishliterature, and to the general reader.
