Special Issue

A double issue of *Helix* devoted to the work of the great and controversial poet, Ezra Pound, has been scheduled for publication during 1982.

It will be edited by Noel Stock, who was born in Melbourne (where he founded the Poundian journal *Edge*), and who is the author of numerous critical works on the poet, and of the authoritative *Life of Ezra Pound*. He is compiling this issue in close collaboration with Mary de Rachewiltz, Pound's daughter, and the author of *Discretions*.

This will be the first substantial Australian publication to direct attention to Pound. It will include among other items:

Unpublished work by Ezra Pound

Unpublished Pound family documents and photographs

A memoir by Mary de Rachewiltz of her father

New material on Pound from U.S. Government sources

Essays on Pound's mental state, and on his time as a psychiatric patient at St. Elizabeths Hospital

A memoir of Melbourne in the fifties

Excerpts from *Edge*

An account of the Australian reception of Pound

Pound's friendship with Frederic Manning

Unpublished letters from Pound to F. S. Flint

Letters from Pound and Williams to James Laughlin

An excerpt from a new biography of T. E. Hulme

Pound as an academic industry

Pound's use of Legge's Chinese translations

An account of Pound, Dante and Gramsci
